Membership: Rick Storm was collecting renewal dues at the meeting and reported no new applicants this period. A motion to drop members that have not renewed was approved. Rick read off eleven names of those who hadn't paid their dues and they were dropped.

MODEL OF THE MONTH: No one brought a model; however, it was commented that "Lee Moore was still building it."

"Crash Chronicles" **Kevin Pellone** told of flying his Easy Sport, having a great time when it got into a spiral and ended up in the trees "somewhere in that direction". He and his wife along with Gary Sustala went on the search, but no luck. So he unpacked his Escapade, got it started, placed it on the runway, and juiced it! That's odd; it barely made it off the ground! It was in the air, but it was a handful. He was barely able to go around and over the pond to get it back on the runway. It turned out that his radio's elevator trim was bumped way forward. Gotta check that stuff!

Kevin also reported that **Nick Rios** was there and flew his **trainer**. After flying a while, a storm cloud caused a micro burst so that it seemed like a **50 mph wind** was causing the plane to do uncontrolled 3D maneuvers. Nick

started to give the control to Kevin, but **Nick kept his cool** and was able to safely land it.

Jim Branaum told of flying his second hand Carbon Cub and it flipped on landing. When he fixed the minor damage, he noted that landing gear was turned backwards. He turned it around and now it lands much better!

Terry Ullman reported that several months ago his foamy Extra 300 crashed in the field when he couldn't bring it around. Months later he was flying a little **Vapor** and thought it had a faulty ESC because the motor would shut down at high throttle position but would come back on when the throttle was lowered. Last month he hand-launched his electric Corsair, and it headed toward the fence. He gave it more throttle to pull it up, but it didn't respond and went into the ground! All these crashes occurred using his DX6I. He used the **MONITOR function** on the radio and found that as he approached high throttle position, the radio suddenly signaled closed throttle, for all planes in the memory. Looking online, it was reported that the DX6I has had variable resistor problems on the control sticks. He opened the radio, took off the throttle resistor cover, and cleaned the wiper and carbon base trails. Back together, the **MONITOR** now shows the throttle works properly!

Humberto Perez reported that some of the plywood used in his plane was coming delaminated, likely from the high humidity we've experienced or inferior glue. So you need to periodically inspect your plane's construction.

Dawn Patrol Rally


September 9th 2017 Old Kingsbury Aerodrome, Kingsbury TX 78638
