Old Business:

The BUILD'N FLY Event happens OCTOBER 21

George Wilson received some coupons for 25% off of one order from Sig Products. He also got two kits "short" kits, furnished by Lazer Works (www.lazer-works.com) and Flite Test, plus \$160 worth of assorted prizes to win with tickets earned by registration and each time you fly during the event.

New Business: None

Model of the Month:

Sidney Hipp presented his huge "Ultra Stick 33". He said he has always favored the design and the flight characteristics so he decided to go BIG. The Hanger 9 ARF has a wing span of 81 inches and is rated for a 30 cc engine or electric equivalent. Sidney decided to go electric, using an Eflite 160 motor powered with 10S 5000 mAh LiPo. He is using 100 in-oz analog servos, with a 6 V NiMH battery for the receiver, with AS3X for stability. He gets three easy going flights on one charge. LiPo charging and discharging: Sidney said charging the large batteries take 1-3 hr depending on the discharge level.

The mention of battery charging issues led to a discussion of LiPo charging and discharge safety. It was noted that two club members recently suffered major property losses when proper LiPo charging processes were not followed. All were reminded not to leave LiPo's unattended during the charging process, use only compatible chargers, and always use a balancer circuit with cut off. Some charges offer a thermal shut off at >50 C. Take care in storing LiPo batteries with cell voltage at 3.7 to 3.8. If your battery is no longer useful or a cell is faulty, one way to safely discharge the battery is to place it in a salt water bath, sometimes for days if needed. Then, after you have verified the voltage is gone, it would probably be a good idea to drive a nail through the body of the battery. That way no charge can build up. Also, you might want to clip off the connector because it can come in handy later.

"Crash Chronicles"

Jim Branaum mentioned that he lost a cell when flying his Carbon Cub powered with a 6S 3200 mAh LiPo. Shortly after takeoff he lost power and barely made it over the fence and back on the field. **George Wilson** also had a similar experience.

Kevin Pallone's Lost Easy Sport was found by Gary Sustala's son in the area where Kevin thought it had crashed. Only it wasn't on the ground, it was hanging in a tree by its nose wheel. The only real damage was it short of a tail! The motor was fine even after being rained on. Kevin told of losing control of the plane as it started circling and was unresponsive. Rick Storm commented that it may have been caused by a fault with the Spektrum AR 600 receiver.


