Date: 11/7/2017, 7:06PM
The meeting of the Prop Busters was called to order by Charles
Strang at IHOP, 14424 San Pedro
Ave, just north of Bitters on 281.

Visitors: No Strangers.

The October meeting minutes were approved.

President: Charles welcomed all.

VP/Safety Officer: Bob reminded all to stay hydrated and watch out for snakes and ants.
We have Sevin dust at the field for ant combat.

Secretary: Terry no comment.

Treasurer: Jim reported the various expenses, income, and account balances. If you need details contact Jim. The proposed budget for next year was reviewed. The events budget for food was increased and discussed briefly. The take away was to make sure we have plenty of food to serve all event attendees: "if we have it, we should cook it". Also, Charles will be ordering more material for name tags, which will likely hold us over for several years.

Newsletter: Standing order for the newsletter is that free ads and articles of interest for the newsletter need to be submitted by members to **John Gardner** by the 17th.

Web Editor: Robert Jarzombek has updated the website to

include posting pictures and our upcoming events.

Membership: Rick Storm reported **no new** members.

Early Bird Raffle: Jack Stensgraad won the fuel.

Old Business:

Build'n Fly: George Wilson and CD Bob Severance described the event attended by 23 pilots along with several spectators. There were more than 50 planes of all different size at the field. One in particular was the favorite, a "Super Stearman" with a 10 ft wing span powered by a gas DLE 170.

The next Build'n Fly has been proposed for October 20, 2018 for AMA sanction.

The plans for **next year** will include some improvements: most related to the pilots meeting. Many pilots arrived throughout the morning, so in the future the "Pilots Meeting "will be in writing, to be passed out during registration. It will include information and flight guidelines, use of a spotter, define the flight line, explain the raffle ticket distribution associated with flying, and other information as needed. Also, a different type/color of ticket will be used for pilot lunch, and the raffle will be held later in the day to prolong pilot participation. After discussion, a budget of \$350 was approved for this event next year.

Air Show at Kelly: Rick Storm reported that he was informed of Prop Busters' inclusion for a static display about a week before the event and scrambled to get it together. He lined up participants and interfaced with military to work out logistics. Models from Rick, Lee Moore, Jack Stensgraad, Bob Severance, Terry Ullman, Dean Lukover, and Ron Wall (of TCF) were set out in a hanger for static display. Rick also set up a Real Fight Simulator. Although we were located near show center, our assigned hanger was oriented such that you could not see the flight line, so we didn't get as much traffic as we had hoped for. Nevertheless, we generated interest and some visitors took a shot at flying on the simulator. The **reset button** was their friend.

New Business:

Officer Nominations Are Open Cub Scouts: Terry Ullman

requested permission to invite a group of Cub Scouts to the field for some buddy box time on a trainer. It was recommended that Saturday morning would be best. It was approved, but no date was set, and the date of the visit will be coordinated with the club.

"Crash Chronicles"

Bob Severance was flying his Sig **Cougar ST-51** near the end of the runway when the response was strange during his bank turn but he was able to bring it around

and did a touch and go, but then the plane rolled inverted and turned to the ground. He suspects the "Orange" receiver failed. So, he put his Tiger 60 in the air and was really enjoying a great flight and upon landing, the plane ran out fuel, dropping about 6 ft, with minor damage. **Terry Ullman** told of momentarily losing his mind while flying his 25% Yak-54. It was up at good altitude, but the next moment it was upside down heading for the ground. He pulled instead of pushing. The motor, some hardware, and electronics survived, but the plane is history. Jim Branaum was flying his 30cc Extra testing his prop choice at San Angelo. After flying various maneuvers, it was time to land. After setting up to land he backed off the throttle but the engine tried to die. He powered up, went around, tried again but this time the engine stopped and plane stalled into the ground. It was out of fuel.

Dave Gell came down from Washington to visit and attend the Build'n Fly. He flew his PT 40 and demonstrated some exciting take offs.

Kevin Pellone was having some control problems flying in unfamiliar wind, but he was able to pull up to avoid a tree. The plane **stalled**, but landed safely under the tree.

There was a question of failsafe settings and Rick reminded all to set the sticks where you want, THEN BIND.


