Old Business:

Event: The next sanctioned event will be the "Pop Gun 40", held on May 5 dedicated to flying smaller planes. As this date coincides with "Cinco de Mayo", tamales, rice and beans will be served.

FAA: FAA registration is once again required! As before, it is up to the pilot to comply. The club and AMA do not police compliance.

New Business:

Stamps: We use stamps to send out newsletters and other communications. Jim noted that stamp prices are expected to go up and we need more anyway. He proposed buying \$200 worth now for future use. After minimal discussion the motion to buy \$200 worth of forever stamps was approved.

Other Events: Dean Lukover, who is also a member of Tri City Flyers (TCF) updated us on their upcoming events. On May 19th, TCF will have their War Bird Event at Kingsbury.

Model of the Month: Kevin Pellone showed his 4-Star 20 that he built from a kit. He customized it by rounding off the wing tips and transformed it from a tricycle gear to a tail dragger. He used red bars on the wing bottom for improved visibility. Powered by an electric motor, the plane weighs about 2 ½ pounds.

Jim Branaum lost a wheel while flying but was able to land reasonably well and found the wheel. Rick Strom pulled off a carrier landing by catching the fence wire and snapping off the nose of his Giles 202. Kevin **Pellone** bought the Hell Cat from Dean Lukover and on his first flight, he made two laps with only one wheel retracted. He tried to get both wheels up and down, but one refused to cooperate. He was able to skid it in, just under

the fence. **Dean** then confessed that his Hell Cat headed for the trees after takeoff, but was essentially undamaged, just torqued the wing a bit. Someone commented they lost a plane in a nose dive because of what turned out to be a bad solder joint.

Warbirds over Kingsbury


May 19th 2018 Old Kingsbury Aerodrome, Kingsbury TX 78638
