The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, after which the meeting of the Prop Busters was called to order by President Charles Strang at IHOP, 14424 San Pedro Ave, just north of Bitters on 281.

President: **Charles** welcomed everyone and opened the meeting. **No strangers** and the **August Minutes** were **approved.**

VP/Safety Officer: **Bob Severance** reminded all to fly safe and stay hydrated, and watch out for snakes and insects.

As CD for the upcoming "Lee Moore Memorial Build N' Fly" for October 19 at Tri City Flyers Kingsbury Field, Bob made an appeal for volunteers to help with the event. We are in need of volunteers to prep and cook, someone to take care of registration and fee collection, raffle ticket sales, and a number of other needs. Hours for the event will run from 9am to 3pm. Flight line help is also needed to ensure that pilots have spotters, and to hand out raffle tickets for each flight. With enough volunteers, no one should have work so long that they miss out flying their planes.

Treasurer: Jim reported the current expenses, income, and account balances. Contact Jim if you need details.

Web Editor: Charles volunteered to update the website to include posting the upcoming event and pictures.

Membership: Rick Storm reported one additional member renewal. He also received a letter that he thought was a renewal, but it was actually a letter informing us that a past member, **Dudley Kilpatrick** had passed away. His wife recalled her husband's enjoyment in model aviation as a longtime member of Prop Busters, and she included a check for \$100 to be used to help support Prop Busters membership. Rick will forward a sympathy card and a note of appreciation to Mrs. Kilpatrick signed by all those at the meeting.

Old Business:

The Somerset field is no longer connected to Prop Busters.

Members can fly at San Geronimo Airpark (with a spotter). In addition, Prop Busters have been invited to fly at other club fields. ARCS is located off Shepard Road. George Wilson mentioned that ARCs, hosts an open fun fly the Sunday after their club meeting held on the third Thursday of the month. BAMS is located in Joshua Springs Park, out I-10 West about 6 miles past Borne, Exit 533 toward Welfare, to 78013 FM 289. Enter the park and follow signs to the field. Note that their field is more

of a **morning field,** so plan to go in the morning when the sun is at your back and it is more likely BAMS members are flying.

Sydney Hipp, also a member of BAMS, formally thanked Prop Busters for use of the tractor along with "operators" Jim Branaum, Rick Storm and Bob Severance that helped BAMS with their field modifications.

Field Search: Jim Branaum commented that one of the three potential sights to review was unavailable for use due to the proximity of a wedding venue.

We need about 3 acres for takeoff and landing, with substantial acreage with rights for fly over and to retrieve downed models. Potential locations cannot be too close to a controlled airport landing approach or takeoff path. Keep an eye out for a possible sight whenever you're traveling around the greater San Antonio area.

Sidney Hipp-Won the Plane! Model of the Month



Bob Severance won model of the month with his latest construction project.

Bob showed his completed **Sig Astro Hog**. He moved the fire wall back about ¾ inch to accommodate **RCGF 15cc gasoline engine**. He described locating the choke lever for easy access along with a switch for ignition electronics, and he added an **rpm** read out in the plane's **dash**. He had to add 8-1/2 pounds to balance the tail dragger. His **pilot** figure is "sky racer."

Crash Chronicles:

Bob Severance put his F-35 in the air at the ARCS field with no apparent problem until he soon recognized it was super sensitive. He managed to set up a good glide slope for landing, but he was short and clipped the landing gear and damaged the nose gear as well. Only minor repairs needed, so while he was at it, he added split ailerons so now he has flaps. He took off at Kingsbury, but again ailerons were still sensitive, but now with flaps it started to oscillate. With a wobbling approach, he buried it. He's now working on the nose gear, and will be installing stronger aileron servos.

Jim Branaum recently acquired a Goldberg **40 size Edge 540** so he went to BAMS to try it out.

Started OK, responded to radio input, so took off. Yee ha! It turned out to be seriously tail heavy with sensitive elevator control. After a few rounds, he was able to get on the ground. He'll be adding some lead! Next up, Jim put a Hanger 9 Beaver in the air when the tail wheel fell off and poor elevator control caused the overall poor plane response, but gravity helped him get back on the ground.

Kevin Pellone was flying his UMX P-47 close to the ground when a weed stem yanked it to the ground. He's done this before, so he needs a little more altitude!

Summary: Perform radio control checks and control surface responses. Decide on high or low rates. Check landing gear operation, and confirm the balance before you take off.

Once in the air, maintain enough altitude to stay out of the weeds!

Thank all of you for sticking with us while we seek to acquire a new flying field for general use.

We still have permission to use the San Geronimo Air Park Runway for Model aircraft Operation. Just a reminder, this runway is also used by full scale aircraft. You must always yield to the full-scale aircraft and have a safety observer with you at all times to spot full scale aircraft in the area. This works best for folks who can visit San Geronimo during the week since a nice weekend day is just as good for the full scale aircraft who always have priority on the runway. In addition, the Boerne Aero Modeling Society (BAMS) are allowing Propbuster Members to use their flying field without charge in return for a similar offer we made to them while they were looking for a new field. The ARCs are also providing discounted membership for Propbuster Members.

We have lost flying fields before and have always managed to survive by finding a new place to fly. We also maintain a reserve fund for just this type of occurrence so there is no anticipation of an assessment of any kind being levied on the membership for establishment of a new flying location.


Robert Jarzombek would always help with two even three of these at our events at Somerset. We sure miss him.
